You may have intercepted the news that the State Government announced its intention to transition Year 7 into the secondary arena from 2020. This was originally part of an election promise, however the timing came as a surprise to many of us. Catholic Education South Australia is now meeting with key stakeholders to discuss the impact this will have on schools. In partnership with their respective school boards, country principals will be very much at the front of these conversations. It is too early to speculate on the impact (if any) it will have on St Albert's, however, we are advised that with this announcement comes a funding package to support all schools with the transition.

Planetarium & Latitude

Last Monday the Year 2/3 and 3/4/5 classes travelled to Adelaide on an excursion to the Planetarium and Latitude. At the Planetarium the kids got to travel into space, looking at the night's sky and getting to learn about different constellations, why Earth has different seasons and the wild weather found on different planets and moons within our Solar System. They then travelled to Latitude, a giant playground that allowed our students to climb, bounce and fly! Pastoral Care

Hi everyone,

I hope you are well. The cold weather is setting in and there seems to be a lot of colds and flus around. Here are a few ideas to help avoid getting sick:

- * Wash your hands regularly with soap to avoid germs being spread for you and for others around you.
- * Get plenty of sleep. You need more sleep when you're feeling under the weather, so your body has a chance to fight any bugs and to help you recover.
- * Build up with healthy food. Eating plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables supports your immune system. And that's a lot easier than fighting off the
- * Work out. Working out regularly enhances the immune function.
- * Stay away. Keep your distance from people displaying symptoms like sneezing and coughing.

If you already have a cold or flu, here are some ways to get better quicker:

- * Take some alone time. Stay home and take care of yourself. You'll recover quicker, as well as not spread the germs to others.
- * Watch your symptoms. If it goes from a simple sniffle to a raging sickness, it's best to contact your doctor.
- * Drink plenty of water. It's important to keep your body hydrated and help flush out germs.
- * Dispose of all used tissues. As soon as you have used a tissue throw it out and wash your hands, so that you don't carry any of the germs. If you keep using the same tissue, you may be furthering the cold.

Here is a drink recipe I use to help ward off colds and also help with recovery if I get a cold:
