
We say farewell to Emily Munchenberg and wish her all the best, and thank Dani Formby for stepping up to do quite a few more challenges around the school – a true inspiration.

A parent has recently contacted me to share a story of her child who discovered they were the only one in their class not to be invited to a peer's birthday party. Whilst it is not the position or the business of schools to be directly involved in such matters, invariably we are often a source of guidance and support when it does. I genuinely believe all our parents are sensitive to the needs of others, especially when it comes to the needs of other children. It's what drives our community and it's at the core of what we do. Parents organising a party outside of school should refrain from giving out invitations during school time, particularly if not all children in his or her class are invited. The outcome of such a decision leaves children and families feeling confused, anxious and unnecessarily distressed. I appreciate this is not a common event and ask parents to exercise discretion if their decision to exclude is the exception, rather than the rule.

With a Science topic focused around living and nonliving things, and a HASS topic around oceans, it seemed like the perfect place to go. Around the grounds

As Domenic alluded to in his report, there has been significant development with respect to Grounds and Maintenance. This has long been an area identified by the community as in need of improvement. The COLA Cubby House has been relocated to the area between the Fairy Garden and Music Room, which has now been paved. The space left by the cubby house has been ear-marked for the construction of a new Sports Shed. This will not only assist PE lessons on the COLA but will help to create some extra storage, which is so desperately needed. In consultation with the Parents and Friends and the School Board, the old chook yard will be converted into an outdoor sacred/meditation space. We have many busy, played-based areas around our school, however, we recognise that children also need a place to be still, to reflect, to connect with nature and be in communion with God. If you happen to see me out in the yard and would like to know more about the development of this space, feel free to approach me and I would be delighted to walk you through the initial concept map which includes a water feature, planting of more trees, water misters, dedication of the statue of Mary in a small nature grotto and timber pine partitioning to create a recycling area.
