## From the Literacy Coach

#### **Talk for Writing Program**

Last term, Karen Cash and I attended a two-day workshop on a program called Talk for Writing. This is a popular writing program that has been used in schools in the UK for a long time, and because of its successful results, lots of schools in Australia are now using it. The Talk for Writing program helps children become better speakers, listeners, readers, writers and thinkers. Here is a very brief overview of how a four week unit of the Talk for Writing program would work:

Imitation Stage – This stage is centred around getting the children to learn a particular type of text orally which enables them to internalise the particular pattern of text so that it is added to their linguistic repertoire.

Innovation Stage – This stage involves manipulating the learned text from the imitation stage so that children focus on key features and intended learning from the text.

Independent Application Stage – This stage involves children using all the key learning from the unit to have a go at producing their own piece of writing.

We are trialling the program with the Reception to Year Two students this term.
