## School Lunches via Qkr! App

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

Although the transition to an online lunch ordering system has worked well, we are starting to encounter a recurring problem.

Some children are claiming they 'didn't receive their lunch order'. Parents need to check thoroughly on the App that each step of the process is completed correctly. The most common error, it seems, is the order being placed on the wrong day, items entered incorrectly, child's name not on the order, missing a step in the process or the order itself was not saved/processed.

At school we receive a print out of exactly what has been sent digitally to the Mini Mart. If the error is on the part of the business, we can fix it here at school. If the error is on the part of the parent then there's not much we can do, however, we do offer the child a basic sandwich so they don't go hungry, etc.



## Teaching and Learning

With the official return of face-to-face teaching at St Albert's, I wanted to pay tribute to our amazing staff who responded to the many demands placed on them in the closing weeks of Term One. There was so much uncertainty and so much change. Traditional teaching models were turned on their head and in a very short period of time, staff re-designed pedagogy and content to suit online delivery even though we had little to no experience with it, like most teachers across the country. We encountered some hiccups with the technology but quality teaching and learning prevailed. Your messages of support and encouragement during this time meant a lot; it kept us going and felt like a virtual pat on the back! We are very grateful to you.

#### **COVID Measures**

All schools have been directed to action the following safety and hygiene measures, for which St Albert's is fully compliant:

- Student desks, doors and high access areas disinfected daily by the teacher;
