Farewell

It was a great privilege to attend the farewell assembly for Bishop O'Kelly at St Mark's College, Port Pirie. The principals all met the night before to share in a final mass and then later a delicious meal prepared by former MKR contestant, Lyn Elbourn.

The assembly, however, was something very special. There were several speeches and a well-prepared and entertaining skit called, "What do Bishops Do!?" It was my honour to speak on behalf of diocesan principals at the assembly. I shared some of the collective affection held for the Bishop and his strong advocacy for Catholic Schools and their principals. I spoke briefly of my own experience with Bishop O'Kelly, which began some 25 years ago as a young teacher at St Ignatius' College, Adelaide, where he was headmaster. He had a profound impact on so many young teachers appointed at that time of expansion. For the first time, I truly came to appreciate the dignity and the calling of our profession. He helped us to understand our Catholic tradition where the teacher is a model; a teacher of life not simply the instructor of a subject. Those formative lessons have always stayed with me.

Bishop O'Kelly, has been a wonderful shepherd of our flock. Pastoral, visionary, a voice to the voiceless, evangeliser of the faith, leader and friend. A lived example of the motto on his coat of arms, "To Love and To Serve."

Go gently into retirement, Bishop O'Kelly and thank you.
